UN IPCC Report (2018)

Significant differences between 1.5°C and 2°C

- Health, livelihoods, food security, water supply, economic growth
- Population exposed to water stress (extreme drought, rainfall deficits, and risks due to water availability) 50% lower
- Hundreds of millions fewer people at risk of climate-related poverty.
- Low-income countries & island nations will be most impacted.

Path to 1.5 Degrees C

- 45% reduction of GHG by 2030
- Net-zero emissions by 2050 at the latest


Current commitments = disastrous 3C+ of warming.





